



Hello TCA Members!

It's that time again – the Texas Legislature has returned to Austin for its biennial legislative session. The House and the Senate convened on Tuesday, January 14th for the 140-day session that will conclude on June 2.

The Legislature

Because it was the first week of Session, the Legislature's business was largely ceremonial and organizational, but not without fireworks. As you may know, there has been a contentious race brewing in the House for Speaker. Former Speaker Dade Phelan had indicated in early December that he would not run again. There were three members that threw their hats in the ring: Rep. David Cook (R-Mansfield); Rep. Dustin Burrows (R-Lubbock); and Rep. Ana-María Rodríguez Ramos (D-Richardson). After two rounds of voting, the House elected Rep. Dustin Burrows as speaker, 85-55 (Rep. Ramos lost the first round; runoff was between Cook and Burrows). The headline being the breakdown of Speaker Burrows' votes of 36 Republicans and 49 Democrats. Now we wait and see what kind of retribution is in store, if any, for Republicans who voted for Rep. Cook. The first clue will be House committee assignments which are expected early next month.

As far as the other chamber goes, the Senate elected a new President Pro-Tempore, Senator Brandon Creighton (R-Conroe); and Sen. Judith Zaffirini (D-Laredo) is the new "Dean" of the Senate (longest serving member of the Senate).

Both the House and the Senate have adjourned until Wednesday, January 22th due to the Martin Luther King, Jr. holiday and presidential inauguration on Monday.
